The Domino Effect

When one life is impacted, there's a domino effect. This is so evident in Wanda's life, (not her real name).

Wanda grew up in a home where **alcohol and weed** were the normal weekend culture. She started drinking when she was 16 and smoked pot when she was 26. She married in her early twenties, had two sons and discovered that her husband had become an alcoholic. One of her boys is now a young adult and is struggling with the same culture in which she grew up.

Depression and low self-esteem plagued Wanda, and drugs and alcohol were how she responded.

Searching for an answer, she began attending a church in the neighbourhood and **accepted Christ as her Lord**, and was given the strength to stop drinking.

However, the struggle with weed continued. Wanda kept **her addiction** hidden because she felt shameful and believed it was too big a burden to share with others. She felt her addiction was hopeless and that she would probably die an addict. Wanda is grateful that this was not God's plan for her. One day she happened to read our

newsletter and started attending **God, Coffee & Me**, the Bible study in a local Mimico coffee shop. She admits that she would sometimes meet a friend, smoke up, and come to the Bible study high. But she sensed that the people at this gathering loved her as part of the Body of Christ. She started to read Scripture daily. She began to feel hope, strength and purpose in her life and shares that God started to convict her. She realized she needed to quit and would not get help if she continued to hide her addiction. *(continued on page 2)*

Her husband and boys see the difference. She loves how God is **hearing her prayers and slowly healing her family**. Her husband has been sober for a year now and God is using her to speak into her mother’s life. Wanda has been continually praying for those she used to hang out with and looks forward to the day when they accept Christ as well.

WHAT CHRISTMAS AT GREAT FINDS MEANS TO ME



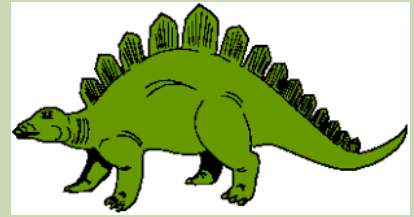
I remember my first experience with **Stonegate Ministry** in 2010 at the old **Outreach store** on Berry Rd. My son and I had just discovered the store during Christmas time, so we went inside to take a look around.

At the time, I was unemployed, having lost my job due to a restructuring process at the company I had worked for 21 years. I had just explained to my son that things were tight with money and that he may not get many gifts for Christmas that year from me.

When we went into the store, we were able to find a couple of shirts on sale for my son. One of the volunteers – who is still a volunteer at the store to this day - helped us out and even tried to accommodate my low budget at the time. However, it was only when we got to the toy section that my son's eyes really lit up, for there on the floor was the biggest toy dinosaur he had ever seen. He went down on the floor, picked it up and then looked at me with pleading eyes.

The dinosaur was \$2 and of course, we had to get it. The Outreach store also had a Christmas tree, decorated with several individual ornaments that my son was able to choose for our small tree at home.

Though it was just a simple toy and some ornaments, it made such an impact on our lives. For a brief moment, we were given a glimpse of hope and light that day, and our lives did not seem quite so bleak and discouraging.



Having experienced that moment, each Christmas here at **Great Finds** I take some time to look around the store. When I see the Christmas tree adorned with ornaments and the festive lights and decorations hung throughout, I think back to that day with my son when we had very little, and give thanks for the blessings my son and I received that day and every day since.

I am so blessed to be amongst the Volunteers of Great Finds who dedicate their time to serve not only our regular customers, but also those who are homeless and need shelter and clothing; those who are hungry and thirsty; those who are lost and alone; and those who are sick and fearful.

Through the years, Great Finds has not only become a great place to shop, it has become a meeting place, a social gathering, a safe haven and an extension of a family home. I thank all the volunteers and the community of customers and donors who have become part of the Stonegate Ministry family, and I count all the blessings that have been given to ensure that Great Finds continues to do God's work during Christmas and throughout the whole year.
