- The lack of companionship and mental support for the lonely
- The need for assistance for immigrant families housed in local motels with no food prep facilities
- Family winter apparel, especially for new immigrants
- The hope of providing a few Christmas gifts for their children and a special Christmas meal



Through God's blessing in the form of generosity from you, - our community of supporters, - we were able to provide Christmas toys and Christmas food vouchers for our Food Bank clients. Also, through your faithful giving the Ministry has been able to start the New Year, having met virtually all these needs, and also being very close to meeting our break-even target. Other community organizations such as Kiwanis and the Greey-Lennox Foundation rallied to the cause, and our community of individual donors not only gave generously themselves but have also encouraged their friends to help out. - "God, coffee and me" is a place where I feel safe. It is where I hear the truth. It is where we can share the gospel with one and another. ## **CIRCLE OF FRIENDS**



### for LOVE AND FAMILY

In May 2023, in fear for their lives, David and Eunice along with their three children, fled Uganda to find sanctuary in Toronto. They were admitted into Canada as refugees and the government housed them in The Queensway Motel while their application was being reviewed.

Without much money to feed their children, David walked around the neighbourhood looking for a library to find a computer to search for resources for his family. He happened to come along Park Lawn Rd and found our **Stonegate Ministry and Christ Church St. James' Celebration Sizzler** in full swing. He excitedly called Eunice to bring the children to our event.

Held in the parking lot of CCSJ, our **Celebration Sizzler** provides free food and drinks, games, prizes, entertainment, and fellowship to the whole neighbourhood. We hold this annual event to build community and provide opportunities for people to have a free meal in a social gathering. What a relief it was for David and Eunice because that day they did not have enough food to feed their children.

Since then, David and Eunice and their children have become active members at CCSJ. The family has since moved to a shelter, but they come to Sunday service regularly. The children are involved in the Youth Group and Sunday School; David and Eunice have become active at the church and are also regular volunteers at the Food Pantry.

Last summer, Eunice gave testimony during a church service about how CCSJ had welcomed her and her family. With tears in her eyes, she proclaimed her love for the church and the people who helped her family as their

own. Eunice cannot thank the people of the church enough for their generosity. They look forward to church every Sunday because they know they will see their 'family', a family that cares and loves beyond colour, race and blood. I have had the joy of getting to know David and Eunice and their 3 children. It warms my heart to know that Eunice and their youngest child Lian considers me as one of their best friends and I too, look forward to every Sunday when I can see my 'family'.
